Share Time: Children may bring one thing that GOD created to share with the class. Please have your child put the share item in your child's cubby, with their name clearly marked.

Home Enrichment Activities:

- Review the classroom rules with your child. During morning drop off encourage your child's self-help skills by letting your child to unpack their own backpack and placing the items where they go. Mrs. Muesse is always here to help to encourage your child to develop independence and confidence.
- Take out some paper crayons or markers and encourage your child to create a picture for a new friend in the classroom. They can deliver the next day to their friends' cubbies! This will encourage the students to get to know each other!
- Each one of us is so special and deeply loved by God. Read Psalm 139:1-18 and paraphrase it to your child. Say a prayer with your child, thanking God for creating everything and making each person unique, with individual gifts, talents, and characteristics.

Folders: Each student will receive a folder. They will be sent home and return to school daily. Homework packets will be sent home weekly. Once your child has completed their homework packet, they will bring it back to class inside their folder and place it in the return tray. Please note: all students will receive a homework packet; however, it is optional. Students can turn their packet in anytime and work at their own pace. Homework encourages independence and self-help skills, as well as building fine motor skills.
