Enrichment Activities:

- Please read *Genesis: 6:9-22, 7:1-8, 8:1-19*. Noah was a righteous man who walked faithfully with God, but the earth was corrupt in God's sight and full of violence. God told Noah that He would send a flood that would destroy all life and told Noah to build an ark that would hold his family, as well as two of every animal. An ark is a big boat. Noah wanted to obey God, so he built an ark. After Noah, his family, and all the animals were safely inside the ark, it rained for 40 days, and the waters flooded the earth for 150 days. Noah sent out a dove to see if it was safe to get off the ark. The dove returned with an olive leaf and Noah knew the water on the earth had gone down. He waited another seven days and sent the dove out again, and it didn't return. Noah knew that he and his family, as well as all the animals, would be able to get off the ark soon. We learned in this Bible story that, because Noah obeyed God, he and his family were spared.
