Enrichment Activities:

- Take a walk with your child and go on a leaf hunt. Some things to discuss might be: leaf size, color, shape and quantity.
- After going on a leaf hunt, you can use some of the leaves collected to make a collage. Your child will love squeezing glue onto the leaves and arranging them on a piece of paper.
- If you have leaves that have fallen off your tree, have your child help you rake them into a big pile. Then have fun throwing them up in the air and letting them fall all around.
- Read Exodus 12:1-14, 43-51. Last week we talked about how Moses went to Pharaoh and told him to "Let God's people go!" Pharaoh said "No" to Moses and Pharaoh wouldn't listen to God sent the 10 plagues. This week's story begins the night of the 10th plague. God had told Moses that they were to put the lamb's blood on the doorposts of their homes, and the Lord would pass over the house, and everyone inside would be spared (what a prophetic picture of Jesus, the lamb of God, who came to take away the sins of the world)! So, the Hebrew people and all those believed, put the lamb's blood on their doorways & stayed inside their homes. They trusted God. That night when the Lord went through the land, He saw the lamb's red blood on the doorways of the Hebrew doors and passed over their homes. For the Egyptians who did not put the lamb's blood on their doorways, the first-born sons died. Pharaoh's own son died that night. Pharaoh was very sad and mad. He told Moses to take God's people and go. They left Egypt in haste in a great exodus. Moses and the people got as far as the Red Sea, but Pharaoh had changed his mind and sent his army to go after the people. But God protected the Hebrew people and performed another miracle! He told Moses to lift up his staff, and then the Red Sea was parted for the people to walk across on dry ground. After the people had safely crossed, the water came down. The Lord delivered them from Pharaoh! Moses and God's people were free!
